**ORDINANCES: ORV/ATV Ordinance: Section 72.00:** An ordinance adopted for the purpose of authorizing and regulating the operation of off road vehicles (ORVs) and all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) on certain streets within the City of Brown City, for the purpose of providing penalties for the violation thereof, and for the distribution of public funds resulting from those penalties pursuant to 2008 PA 240, MCL 324.81131 (green). In accordance with MCL 324.81131, and at the direction of the City Council, the ordinance was submitted to the DNR, MDOT and the Sanilac and Lapeer County Road Commissions. The City received no responses. If the City Council wishes to proceed with the Ordinance, a single Councilmember must introduce the ordinance, then the City Council should schedule a public hearing, then decide to adopt, not adopt, or table the Ordinance following the public hearing. If adopted, the Ordinance would become effective after 30 days. How does the City Council wish to proceed?
